Summer Programs Kickoff Event at Betty Rodriguez Library

The Fresno County Public Library will formally launch its Summer Challenge and Lunch at the Library programs on Monday, June 12, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. This event will be held at the Betty Rodriguez Regional Library, 3040 N. Cedar Ave, near the corner of Cedar and Shields avenues.
