By the Numbers

As you know, many businesses start to slow down at this time of year. Not so for the library. Here are some notable figures that show business is booming for us:

- Since opening one year ago, Biola monthly circulation has increased by a whopping 1,100%!
- We're up 3% from this time last year for circulation across the system.
- We're up one-half percent (.5%) from this time last year for new borrowers.
- Digital Branch circulation is up almost 55% from this time last year.

I was fortunate to attend the 2013 Board Source Leadership Forum in L.A. last week. What a great opportunity ... an entire conference dedicated to non-profit board governance! Some key take-aways for me were the need for strategic planning for boards and the importance of board accountability. Many sessions stressed the need to plan, set goals, and follow-up and reevaluate continually. Additionally, making sure the board and director really understand the mission of the organization and core activities was stressed as critical components to success.

- The Out of the Box kiosk branch will launch in January.
- Renovations will commence on the Sanger Branch in December.
- The hunt for administrative and headquarters facilities continues.
- Administrative staff have met with officials from Clovis and Reedley regarding plans for new libraries. Discussions are on-going with no definite plans at this time.

Partnerships

- The Grizzlies Community is collaborating with the Library to expand its decade-old Wild About Reading program, which focuses on improving literacy through an agriculture education platform. Currently, Wild About Reading is offered to 175 schools, reaching over 102,000 students annually, throughout the Central Valley of California. The Grizzlies have offered Fresno County libraries educational materials and support, including Farm Grown magazine and scheduled visits by Parker, to all various library branches. The first group targeted by the newly expanded program will be children who are home-schooled. As with the traditional school-based program, the Grizzlies will offer free baseball tickets as incentive to complete "Parker's Challenge," which requires reading ten books in five weeks.
- The Library is working with the Children's Movement to advance the need to have children reading on grade level by Grade 3. The Library is ideally positioned to assist with this important initiative and we will participate in reading programs, parent education, and other events to improve our children's standing in Fresno.
- The Library is working with the Maddy Institute to launch a Citizenship Academy which will enable participants to improve their English language skills and study for the citizenship through classes offered at select libraries in the County. We are also partnering with Radio Bilingue and FUSD on this important initiative.
