Kingsburg Library to Reopen on April 21st After Facilities Upgrades

Fresno County, CA – The Kingsburg Library will reopen to the public on April 21st following a temporary closure for facility improvements. During the closure, crews completed upgrades to the library’s public spaces, including the installation of new flooring and updated LED lighting throughout the building.

“We are pleased to welcome the community back to the Kingsburg Library,” said Sally Gomez, Director and County Librarian of the Fresno County Public Library. “These improvements reflect our ongoing commitment to maintaining library spaces that support the needs of our communities.”

The Kingsburg Library will resume regular operating hours upon reopening. Patrons can browse collections, use public computers, and access the full range of library services.

These improvements are part of a countywide effort to update library facilities and ensure continued access to library services in the future. The project is funded through Measure B, the voter approved library tax that supports library services and facility improvements across Fresno County.

The Fresno County Public Library looks forward to welcoming the Kingsburg community back into the space and invites residents to stop by and experience the updated library.
